EDITORIAL 50

Fifty Reasons For Optimism

Although it is not easy to look back over 50 months, one thing is certain: during all these months, the Minority NEWS monthly newsletter has both enabled the majority community to learn more about all important events in the lives of members of national minorities and the national minorities to become better acquainted with each other. For 50 months we have tried to record and shed light on the most important issues and events for the national minorities in Serbia, and, accordingly, this Minority NEWS jubilee 50th issue focuses on one of the most important events for members of national minorities - elections for members of national councils of national minorities.

The Republic Electoral Commission announced the first lists of candidates on August 23 and the last one at a session held on October 22. The Commission members have approved registration of the total of 58 lists of 18 national minorities, who will elect members for their councils in direct elections. The Ruthenian and Albanian national minorities have the highest number of candidates lists registered, 7 and 6, respectively, whereas Greeks, Poles and Slovenians have one each.

National councils of the Croatian, Macedonian, Montenegrin and Russian national minorities will be selected through electoral assemblies, and, to this end, a total of 379 electoral applications have been approved by the decision of the Ministry of State Administration and Local Self-Government.

Regardless of the way they will be elected, members of the national minority councils, as legitimate representatives of their minority, will represent the interests of their minority in the next 4 years and, as we have heard many times, will act as a bridge between the authorities and the citizens of their minority. This "bridge" should be both firm enough to withstand all the difficulties and alert enough to avoid potential malversations.

And it seems that the list of alleged abuses of the electoral process has been longer this year than it was the case in the previous elections. As the media reported, as well as the minority communities themselves and the civil society organizations, the number of members of a few communities registered in the Special Voters List has increased disproportionately in the last couple of months, the political influence over the lists of candidates has been widely spread, and incidents have been reported among the candidates. We can only hope that new members of national councils will indeed be elected in a legitimate manner and that they will rather advocate for interests of the members of their minorities than encourage and deepen divisions within them, as it has been the case thus far.

Electoral Applications Approved

In the period from August 17 to October 4, 2018, a total of 382 electoral applications were submitted to the Ministry of Public Administration and Local Self-Government (82 members of the Croatian national minority, 103 members of the Russian national minority, 117 members of the Montenegrin national minority and 80 members of the Macedonian national minority).

A total of 379 electoral applications have been approved by the Ministry's decision, as follows:

- 82 electoral applications from members of the Croatian national minority
- 103 electoral applications from members of the Russian national minority
- 115 electoral registrations of members of the Montenegrin national minority
- 79 electoral registrations of members of the Macedonian national minority.

For all four national minorities, the minimum number of electoral applications was confirmed, thus the conditions for convening the electoral assembly have been met.

The National Council of the Croatian National Minority will have 29 members, Montenegrin and Macedonian National Minority Councils will have 23 members each, while the Russian National Minority Council will have 15 members.
